**3) MECHIRAT CHAMETZ - SELLING THE CHAMETZ**



If someone owns a lot of Chametz, they are allowed to sell it to a non-Jew before Pesach. One must go to a Rabbi to arrange the selling of the Chametz. Any Chametz that is left in the ownership of a Jew during Pesach and was not sold, is \_\_\_\_\_ allowed to be used after Pesach.

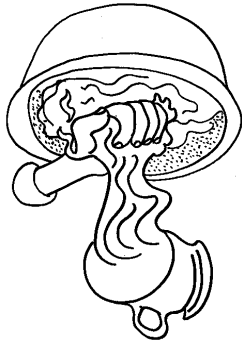


**4) BIUR CHAMETZ - BURNING OF THE CHAMETZ**



It is customary to burn all the leftover Chametz, including the 10 pieces from the Bedikat Chametz, on the morning before Pesach. We then say a blessing called "Kol Chamirah", proclaiming that if any \_\_\_\_\_ remains in our possession that we accidentally did not find or sell, it should be considered like \_\_\_\_\_, as if it didn't exist.

We wash our hands by pouring water on our right hand 3 times, then on our left hand three times, but we don't make a blessing!

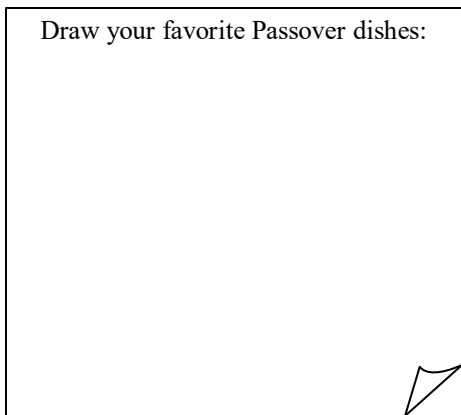
We say the Grace After Meals. We thank Hashem for the delicious meal, and drink the third cup of wine while leaning to the left. \*Cup #3
